

FATHER CARL'S CORNER



Dear Parish Members,

As I write this column, it has been one year since I was asked to take on being Pastor of both newly united parishes in our Oak Park Catholic Community. First, let me say thank you for your prayers and financial support of our parishes. Also, I would like to thank the many volunteers who

help keep our organizations and ministries vibrant and effective. It has been a great blessing to see all the gifts in our individual parish communities and experience the collective larger community coming together in initiatives like the Neighborhood Bridge and the Migrant Ministry to help and care for others.

I am especially grateful to have Father Rex, Moderator of Pastoral Care at Ascension and Saint Edmund, Father Bob, now Father Vittorio and Deacon Tom who serve in the community. At Saint Catherine-Saint Lucy and Saint Giles, Father Tom and Father Ed continue to serve in their retirement with the assistance of Deacon John, Deacon Kevin and Deacon William. The dedication of the parish staffs is admirable, and I am grateful to minister alongside such talented and caring people.

One of the great joys and blessings is saying Mass and having the opportunity to get to know on a much deeper and personal level the workings of each of the parishes and what is valued.

That being said, with the blessings and opportunities, there have also been many challenges. Being a pastor under these circumstances is not what I, or any of my seminary classmates were trained for. We were never taught the art of bi-location (I say that tongue-in-cheek) or how after years of parishioners being a parish family, to now unite with another parish! The challenges of smaller congregations and less contributions are facts that played into Renew My Church and the resulting unification of parishes.

Under the circumstances, I said "yes" to working with these challenges for this reason. Despite the fact that I actually have been told this is about my ego, which it is not, I believe in the gifts and the uniqueness of the Oak Park Catholic community and the wonderful folks, our neighbors, who all choose to be a part of our faith communities. Having been in the community for thirteen years, it seemed the right thing to do, say "yes" and take this on. With the help of our staffs, our parish councils, finance committees and now leadership teams, a connection has been developed to allow us to thrive in the future with fewer priests – priests who will accept the community for the expanding minds and hearts that embrace the circle of God's love for all. As I have come to know you that is what makes our community so special. Perhaps it would have been better to bring in someone completely new to the area to work with this process; however, I said "yes" realizing it takes two years at least to really begin to know the people and the community one is living in and ministering to. A new pastor would have only delayed the momentum that had already begun.

I share this with you since it has been one year since this transition. I also want you to know that one of the most difficult challenges and changes for me is not being able to be more present each weekend at each site. As I am able and as schedules permit, I do look forward to saying Mass, as I have done, once or twice a month at each worship site. I am interested in each community and the challenges and opportunities we face together as we look toward a structure of church that keeps our faith communities vibrant and strong.

I ask you to continue to pray to the Holy Spirit to guide us, and to pray for patience as change and transition can be uncomfortable and take time. If at any time you have questions or comments, please don't hesitate to call or set up an appointment. Those meetings can take place at whichever site is most convenient for you. In the meantime, let us remember the why we are a community of faith, the why we go to Mass at whichever site we worship at, and the why of what we do. Jesus gave the command to Love God and neighbor as ourself. When we do so individually and as a community, we help to build the Kingdom of God here on earth. That is the why, and it is our mission.

In closing - Thank you ... to all who stepped up and helped close the budget "gap" at both parish sites -Ascension and Saint Edmund and Saint Catherine-Saint Lucy and Saint Giles. Your sacrifices and gifts make a difference.

Next weekend, on Sunday, July 14 at 5:00 PM, there will be a special courtyard Mass on the Saint Giles Parish campus to bless our teen mission groups from both parish sites as we send them off on their Appalachian Service Project. **The weekly Oak Park Community Mass will still take place at 5:00 PM at Saint Edmund Church.**

REFLECTIONS FROM RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CATECHIST



Ever discern about sharing your faith within the parish? There are so many opportunities to share your faith with others, especially with the children of the parish. Here are some testaments from our catechists on why they share their faith with our community.

As far as why I am a catechist, for one thing, my best friend was a catechist at her parish for a few vears when her kids were attendina their parish grade school. I thought that was admirable. When I finally finished studying for all the actuarial exams and got my professional credentials, I was looking around for some worthwhile volunteer activity, possibly something involving children, since I like kids but don't have any. I was already in the Saint Edmund's folk choir, and one of the other choir members was a catechist. I started talking to her about that. She introduced me to the Director of Religious Education for the parish, and I became an aide that fall. The catechist for our class was going to Loyola Nursing School and had nursing classes on alternate Sundays. That left me in charge of the class on those Sundays when she wasn't there. At first, it was a little scary, but I enjoyed it. When the catechist graduated from Nursing School in January, became an army nurse, and immediately moved to Texas (surprise!), I didn't mind that I was officially the catechist for the class. After that, I just continued to come back every year. I was lucky that I had a Catholic education from kindergarten through college. I hope that I am helping the children to learn more about their faith and to grow in it. I've met many wonderful families, other catechists, and aides over the years. They have been a real blessing in my life.

Living our Catholic Faith: Springtide Research

Speaker: Brother Armand Alcazar, FSC Saint Giles Courtyard Tuesday, July 9 - 7:00 PM

How do young people live their faith? Gen. Z (or iGens) don't seem to fit the stereotype of what we used to think about teens. How do they differ, what are their needs and how does their faith (or non-faith) link into their mental health? Is there something we can do to best accompany them? Together we will learn from the research from Springtide and consider how it applies to our Catholic communities in the Oak Park area.

Springtide is a leading national research team studying and writing about the needs, behaviors and trends of young people, ages of 13-25, particularly at the cross hairs of their spirituality and mental health.

Brother Armand Alcazar, FSC is a retired a professor of theology from Christian Brothers University and Lewis University. Presently, he is involved in "the Lasallian Legacy Project"- collecting the oral histories

of the Brothers. He is also a presenter for Springtide. Brother Armand gives presentations and retreats internationally on various topics. When not presenting he enjoys singing and playing the piano, cooking, tennis and golf, not necessarily in that order nor at the same time.


